Unfortunately, some of our winners were unable to attend, but the turn-out – particularly among members of the public – was impressive!

We also sold two pieces from the show at the reception! Congratulations to Tonyea Mead, who sold “Ancient Curves,” and Kathy Coyne, who sold “Flamingo.”



The show judge, Joe Terrone, awarded first place to Martha Pileggi for her beautiful oil painting “Learn the Ropes.” Terrone said, “Interesting composition, good paint handling and color combinations.” (Pictured left.)

“Golden Hour,” an oil by Linda Delaney, won second place for its “excellent paint handling and light effects,” Terrone said. Linda is pictured with “Golden Hour” at right.



Kathy Coyne won third place for her acrylic “Water Lilies.” (Pictured above left.) Terrone said, “Good application of the curve theme and the composition is strong, especially in creating space.”

Three honorable mentions were also awarded.



They went to Michael Ng for “Native in a Dust Storm” in oil. Terrone said, “This painting creates a strong mood. The use of a monochromatic palette works very well to enhance that mood.” *(Pictured left.)*

“Curves & Curls,” a watercolor by Carol Yost, also won an honorable mention. Terrone said, “the use of repetitive shapes is effective. Keeping the palette simple helps with all the patterning.” *(Pictured right.)*



“What the Hours Reflect,” a multimedia piece by Joann Sabato, won its honorable mention for its “strong representation of the curve theme.” Terrone continued, “I like the inclusion of time and mirrors.” *(Pictured left.)*
