She works primarily with watercolor, often using the white paper as a color. She combines loose washes, wet-into-wet, dry brush, and all the techniques possible with the transparency of this unique medium.

When not painting she is teaching others to paint, to experience the same joy she has. She believes everyone has the ability to paint whether they know it or not. She volunteers with local youth classes as well as instructs at many of the areas' art leagues.
